LIFE SCREENINGS In last Sunday's bulletin, you may have noticed a bright pink flyer announcing that St. Francis Heart Center is sponsoring a Life Line Screening event here at Southminster on Wednesday, July 21st, 8 AM - 5 PM. These screenings are being offered to our local community at a tremendous savings. The four basic tests offered are stroke/carotid artery screening, heart rhythm screening, abdominal aortic aneurysm screening and peripheral arterial screening (PAD). Pre-registration is required at 1-800-679-5292. A variety of other test/screenings is also offered. If you are considering these tests, you should consult your insurance carrier to see if these are covered by your insurance company. Typically these tests are not covered unless you are exhibiting symptoms and 4 out of 5 stroke victims never show symptoms. More information is available on the Southminster website.
